* H1N1 (swine) flu vaccine provided, if available.

Cash or Check Only / Medicare Part B accepted

Nasal Spray Vaccine for ages 2-49 years:

- Live, attenuated (weakened so it cannot cause flu)
- Not recommended for people with chronic health problems or pregnant women
- Children younger than 5 with asthma or one or more episodes of wheezing within the past year should not get FluMist.

FOR MAXIMUM PROTECTION AGAINST INFLUENZA, it is recommended that children under 9 years old who have received only 1 dose in their first year of vaccination should receive 2 doses the SECOND YEAR they are vaccinated. The doses are separated by at least 4 weeks.

Injectable Flu Vaccine (needle & syringe only) for ages 6 months and older

- Inactivated flu vaccine
- Available for these people:
 - Children 6 months-4 years
 - Adults 50 and older
 - Pregnant women
 - Children on long-term aspirin therapy
 - People with chronic health problems (heart, lung or kidney disease, asthma, diabetes, blood disorders, severely weakened immune systems)

FOR MAXIMUM PROTECTION AGAINST INFLUENZA, it is recommended that children under 9 years old who have received only 1 dose in their first year of vaccination should receive 2 doses the SECOND YEAR they are vaccinated. The doses are separated by at least 4 weeks.
